- 1. EXPLORING TAINAN: 1 credit
- 2. "Area Courses": Students are required to earn 4-19 credits from at least three out of the five study areas (Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural and Engineering Sciences, Life Sciences and health and Interdisciplinary Integration) according to their interest and needed cross domain profession.
 - (1) Students can take courses from other departments and transfer to general course credit. However, the transfer must be made during the semester in which the course was taken. Credit transfer has to be approved by the students' department (transferred course can't be the same as required or elective course in the department) and the Center of General Education, and the maximum number of course credits transferred is 6.
 - (2) Foreign Language course other than English taken at NCKU or other schools can be transfer to general course credit in the humanities area. However, international students cannot take the official language of their country of origin. The maximum number of credits is 4.
- 3. "Comprehensive Courses" includes 'Leadership Forum', 'General Education Lecture Series', 'General Education Forum', 'Learning by Practice' and 'Capstone Courses'. Students are required to earn 1~15 credits from this course. Foreign students (except students from China) can take Area Courses in replacement of Comprehensive Courses.

4. **English Proficiency Test**

Student shall B1 proficiency level in English according to the CEFR with one of the followings:

- (1) Achieving GEPT Intermediate Level
- (2) Achieving 57 or higher on the TOEFL iBT
- (3) Achieving 4.0 or higher on the IELTS
- (4) Achieving 550 or higher on the TOEIC
- (5) Achieving Preliminary Level (PET) on the Cambridge Main Suite
- (6) Achieving 40 or higher on the BULATS
- (7) Achieving other standardized tests equivalent to CEFR-B1 level

Students who have not successfully reached the required threshold may take Online Remedial English (a zero-credit, semester, optional course) or other courses specified by respective departments. Students who successfully pass the required courses are recognized as fulfilling the English proficiency requirements for graduation. The Notes for registering in Online Remedial English are specified separately
